

OBJECTIVE

The **Corus Television Broadcast Scholarship and Internship** is available to students who identify as racialized, Indigenous, living with disability and/or 2SLGBTQ+ who are entering their final year of post-secondary in Television Broadcast studies.

SCHOLARSHIP AND INTERNSHIP DETAILS

- Students who will be commencing their final year of post-secondary studies in September 2024 are eligible.
- Students will receive confirmation of their acceptance in June 2024.
- Internship and mentorship opportunities will only be offered in English.
- Three-month paid internship will take place between May to August 2025.
- Selected students can fulfil a paid internship at *The Morning Show* (based in Toronto) or at local Global News Morning Shows across Canada. Global News Morning Shows locations include Vancouver, Okanagan, Calgary, Edmonton, Winnipeg, Toronto, Peterborough, Montreal and Halifax (excludes journalism and on-air training).
- Student may only participate in the program once.
- **Applications must be submitted no later than 5:00 p.m. EST on May 31, 2024.**

ELIGIBILITY

- Students who self-identify as racialized, Indigenous, living with disability and/or 2SLGBTQ+
- Students who will be starting their final year of studies and are enrolled in a diploma, advanced diploma or degree program with a focus in Television Broadcast studies.
- Students must be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident of Canada.

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- **Please ensure that all links to supporting documents and/or video/audio content are accessible and do not expire.**
- Students are required to submit post-secondary institution **enrolment documentation**.
- Students are required to submit **samples of their school work, personal projects and/or initiatives** that demonstrate a strong sense of storytelling and writing capabilities with script and visuals (can include social media content) to support their application.
- Students are required to submit **a brief outline** of their career objectives and why they aspire to pursue a career in Television Broadcast.
- Students must also submit **a 2-3 minute video** answering **one** of the following questions: (We would like to see **you** in the video, so please limit your use of animation).
 - Where do you aspire to be 10 years from now?
 - What's a difficult challenge you've faced? How did you handle it?
 - Describe a meaningful volunteer, work or school experience you participated in and include how it created impact.
- **One letter of reference** is required to support the application. The person writing the letter of reference should describe their relationship to the applicant in the letter.

- Letter must be dated, signed with an electronic signature and include the reference's contact information. Reference letters must be dated within one (1) year of the supporting document deadline.
- Applicants will be asked to attest to being eligible for the program.

APPLICATION / SELECTION PROCESS

It is important that the individual who completes and submits the application (the student) is the individual who, if successful, will be the student receiving the scholarship and participating in the internship. The student is considered as the owner of the application and must be eligible for the program according to the guidelines.

Step 1 – Students must submit an online application form by clicking the “Apply” button located on the Corus Television Broadcast Scholarship and Internship webpage or through the Careers page on www.corusent.com.

Step 2 - Students will be required to upload all required documents as part of their submission. For video and audio submissions that support the application, students must include all content links in a word document labelled, “Supporting Application Links_NAME and upload the document. Please ensure that all content links do not expire and are located on an accessible platform for access. Only one submission will be counted. All subsequent applications will not be considered.

Step 3 – Application submissions must be completed within the timeframe outlined by Corus.

Step 4 – Application submissions will be reviewed by a pre-determined Corus panel. The selection process will involve Corus employees and industry representatives.

Step 5 – Corus panel will review all applications and select one student for the Corus Television Broadcast Scholarship and Internship program.

Step 6 – Corus will contact the awarded student with confirmation of their scholarship in June 2024.

PAYMENT

The one-time scholarship payment will only be issued to the awarded student upon completion of the scholarship acceptance process.

It is the student's responsibility to ensure that payment of tuition fees is made within the defined time frame set by the educational institution regardless of the timing of the scholarship payment.
